Phase One: Infection Prevention

Essentials — Online

Eight weeks prior to the face-to-face event, you'll be welcomed to the online program, given access to program materials, and invited to network with facilitators and fellow learners as part of an exclusive online community of learner-practitioners. In the online community you'll complete a series of self-directed exercises and assignments on the following topics:

- Microbiology Essentials
- Epidemiology Essentials

- Infection prevention during construction
- Emergency preparedness
- Critical thinking and decision-making methodologies (case study, scenarios)

Phase Two: In-Person, Face-to-Face Session

Facilitated by nationally-recognized infection prevention experts, the one-and-half-day (12-hours) classroom training delves deeply into essential content including:

- CMS, OSHA, and EPA Regulations, and CDC Recommendations

Phase Three: Capstone Project
